BRAZIL COFFEE PROSPECTS

Weather Conditions Are Fair, But a Shortage of Labor Is Causing Difficulties—Flowering Is Well Advanced

São Paulo, August 14, 1935.

A CCORDING to information received from the interior, the flowering of coffee trees is well advanced in some districts, such as the North of the State of Paraná, lower Sorocabana and some parts of the Noroeste Railway. In warmer zones buds have already opened and in others the number of buds, although still unopened, is very large. Growers are annoyed by this fact as the first flowering will not give any result unless showers are present. A grower from Paraná, who has just arrived from a trip to Ipaussú, Mr. Luiz Pinto, Ourinhos (S. Paulo) and the districts of Jacarézinho and Cambará (Paraná), informed us that the showers presently falling there will help the flowering and, as the trees are well prepared, in his opinion, the future crop is also expected to be good. According to his opinion, the present crop will be damaged due to lack of labor which is intense in the newer zones of the State, viz. Sorocabana. The plantations are more or less grown up with weeds and this will cause a great loss of coffee berries. In some plantations he has seen berries still on the trees which were already rotting. In the opinion of another large grower, owning plantations in the so-called Old Zone and the Sorocabana Zone, the future crop will be larger in the Old Districts and smaller in the Sorocabana Zone. His opinion is based on the present aspect of the plantations.

EARLY RIPENING REPORTED

The ripening of berries occurred sooner than was expected, causing difficulties in picking due to the lack of weeding and also to the lack of labor. which is general in the interior of the State of São Paulo. The immigrants arriving from the north of Brazil since last year (more or less 17,000 persons) are not yet adapted to the work at the plantations and cannot be counted as efficient help. Most of these men were expected to go to the cotton plantations, so that the coffee growers had practically no advantage from this new current of immigration started by the Federal Government—MIDDEROS.
